### **Attendance Matters!**

We are currently working hard to increase children's levels of attendance at school: if children are in school then they are learning and making progress. Good attendance and punctuality also set up great habits for later life, the transition to high school and the requirements of the world of work. To put it into context the national average attendance for primary schools is 97%. This week ours was 83%. This is a serious concern to us as a school and also to organisations such as Ofsted who treat this lack of attendance as a safeguarding matter, hence we make no excuses for chasing up attendance and lateness. This is us doing our job to keep your children safe and helping you to avoid prosecution and a hefty fine.

To encourage the children to help you get them to school **every day** and **on time** some of our year 6 children have come with a plan to reward the best class attendance every week. They have chosen a golden cup which will be our school attendance trophy and each week they will collect the attendance figures from the school office and announce the winning class. We did a dummy run this week and the winners were Class Jonah! Well done Class Jonah! This means this class get to keep the attendance cup in their classroom for a week AND have half an hour 'golden/choosing' time on a Friday afternoon which has proved popular with both children and staff!

This does not mean we expect children to come into school when they are ill! We do however expect them to give school a try if they have a headache or a tummy ache. Rest assured that we will send for you if they are not managing the day. So lets make next half term the time when we ALL arrive every day, on time and ready to learn!
