


English

As authors, children will work on orally retelling and then re-writing their own sentences and stories inspired by the series of Funnybones books by Allan and Janet Ahlberg. Children will focus on using description and structuring sentences correctly. We will also read and learn poems about the senses and autumn.



Maths

In maths children will concentrate on counting, ordering and reading and writing numbers at least up to 10 in Year 1 and within 100 in Year 2. We will also focus on addition and subtraction. In addition to maths lessons, the children will begin daily supported maths interventions in Year 1.

Science

As scientists, children will learn about the human body and how we move. They will carry out investigations using their five senses and learn the names of parts of the body. They will conduct research about the body and ask and answer questions. Children will learn about how our skeleton and muscles help us to move, digestion and how our heart pumps blood around the body.

PE


In PE, the children will be trying to challenge themselves and attempt several times if they do not succeed at first. They will be working on their movement, footwork and balance skills, including balancing on one leg. The children will follow instructions carefully and work independently.

BODY



Our topic is 'Who is Jewish and what do they believe?'. The children will learn about Jewish objects and traditions and find out how and why Jewish people celebrate Shabbat. They will also learn the story of Chanukah. Children will celebrate Harvest festival and learn about their class stories: Joseph and Moses.

Art

As artists and designers, children will investigate line in art and how different artists use line. Key artists that they will study will include Miro and Klee. Children will investigate how lines can be made using different materials and develop their pencil control and style.



History and geography

Why do we remember Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale? Children will learn about their lives and find out how the job as a nurse during the Crimean War was very different to modern day nurses. As geographers, children will develop their understanding of maps, aerial photographs and location.



Music

Children will continue to develop their understanding of tempo, pitch and rhythm using the Charanga unit: Hands, feet, heart! Children will explore body percussion and learn the song 'Dem Bones.'

PSHE

We will be focusing on how and why we exercise and why it is important to keep our bodies moving. Children will settle into their new classrooms and we will also explore a range of stories based on different emotions.
